



**Towards an innovative monitoring mechanism of the CFS:  
Monitoring the CFS Tenure Guidelines and the Agenda for Action for Food Security in  
Protracted Crisis**

Five years after the CFS reform, the establishment of an innovative monitoring mechanism is still pending. CSOs have urged the CFS, particularly governments, to take steps towards implementing the monitoring and accountability agenda of the CFS.

As a contribution to this agenda, CSOs want to present a practical example of how the progress of implementation of the CFS Tenure Guidelines (TG), their impacts and their contribution to better tenure governance could be monitored. The side event will also address the monitoring challenge for the upcoming A4A for food security in Protracted Crises.

The side-event will practically show how a space of convergence and dialogue among *different* experiences and *existing* monitoring mechanisms could be created in the CFS, where all actors will benefit from learning and understanding of actions needed to respect and protect the legitimate tenure rights of communities, especially in situations of protracted crisis.
